Following is my Professional Disclosure Statement, which is required of all licensees by the Oregon Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and Therapists.

Qualifications

I received my Masters of Science degree (MS) in Mental Health Counseling from Capella University in Minneapolis, Minnesota, 2012, and my Bachelors of Science in Psychology from Southern Oregon University in 2006. I am a Licensed Professional Counselor Intern in BOTH Oregon (R3155) and Washington State (MHC.LH.60571272), a Certified Alcohol and Drug Counselor, Level-II (Oregon: 13-R-22), and a Nationally Certified Trauma Therapist (CTT-005: This 5 module, 250+ hour training focused on somatic/body-based and experiential approaches to treating unresolved trauma and grief). In addition, I have over 150 hours of training in Peter Levine's Somatic Experiencing from the Somatic Experiencing Institute and I am a level-II trained EMDR practitioner.

Counseling Background, Philosophy and Approach

I have experience working with a wide array of clients including children suffering from PTSD while working for the Oregon department of health and a NASA affiliated youth science-camp in the Middle East. I have acted as a co-facilitator for an impaired medical-professional monitoring support-group in central Florida and helped provide group therapy and individual support for those clients. In 2011, I launched a young men's group at The Refuge-A Healing Place, a world-renowned trauma and addiction treatment program, which specialized in childhood sexual trauma, attachment disorder and addiction. During my time at the Refuge I worked individually with both men and women and I have extensive experience working with issues around adoption and abandonment, sexual addiction, self-harm, distorted self-perception/self-image and severe depression and anxiety. Currently I co-facilitate therapeutic intensive workshops, focusing on unresolved trauma and addiction and I am a national speaker and educator in the field of trauma and addictive disorders: I have been blessed with the opportunity to present, lecture and assist in trainings at mental health conferences and treatment programs throughout the United States and help guide other professionals to do comprehensive trauma therapy. I have advanced training and certifications in EMDR and Somatic Experiencing and I love marrying Somatic and mindfulness based techniques with bi-lateral stimulation to create an experiential process to help my clients resolve past trauma and move toward healing. In addition, I have received training in attachment theory by Dr. Dan Siegel and John and Julie Gottman, and I have specialized training in DBT, advanced experiential and art therapy approaches to healing. I have 8-Years experience in the field of Mental Health and addiction counseling.

Session Fees and Length of Service

Therapy sessions typically run 50-minutes in length at a cost of \$165 per session. A limited number of sliding scale slots may be available on a first-come/first-serve basis. Your appointment time is reserved just for you. If you are not able to make your appointment, kindly notify me at least 24 hours in advance in order to avoid being charged the full fee for your session. If at any time, for any reason, you are dissatisfied with my services, please let me know. I accept cash, check and most major credit cards. I am an out of network provider, as well as in-

network with several insurance carriers (please contact our billing services to inquire if you are covered and details of coverage).

Use of Diagnosis

At this time I provide therapy as a fee for service treatment and I am an out of network provider, as well as in-network with several insurance carriers (please contact our billing services to inquire if you are covered and details of coverage): If you are seeing me as an out of network provider, some health insurance companies will reimburse clients for counseling services and some will not. In addition, most will require that a diagnosis of a mental-health condition and indicate that you must have an “illness” before they will agree to reimburse you. Some conditions for which people seek counseling do not qualify for reimbursement. If a qualifying diagnosis is appropriate in your case, I will inform you of the diagnosis before we submit the diagnosis to the health insurance company. Any diagnosis made will become part of your permanent insurance records.

***As a Licensee** of the Oregon Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and Therapists, I will abide by its Code of Ethics. To maintain my license I am required to participate in annual continuing education, taking classes dealing with subjects relevant to this profession. I may substitute professional supervision for part of this requirement.

As a client of an Oregon licensee [or Registered Intern] you have the following rights:

- To expect that a licensee has met the minimal qualifications of training and experience required by state law;
- To examine public records maintained by the Board and to have the Board confirm credentials of a licensee;
